
Description



6. Sensory Abilities

Description

Accurate visual acuity, sufficient auditory and tactile skills (ability to perceive information corning from the skin touch) are all required to provide safe and effective nursing care.

What are some examples of this?	x Accurately drawup medication to administer to patients
	 Adequate vision to read very small print (e.g. measurements alon syringe, medication container labels, expiry dates)
	 x Perform documentation and rapidly review patient charts and medical records to determine care
	 X Observing patient health care status and adjusting care to suit individual requirements
	Hearing:
	x Accurately take a blood pressure measurement by auscultation
	x Respond to care request by hearing call bell or calls for help
	 Able to respond appropriatelyotmachine alarms e.g. IV pumps instructions in a timely and effective manner
	 Able to detect changes in respiration quality and rate through sound.
	 x Sufficient auditory and tactile ability is necessary to monitor, asse and manage individual's health needs consistently and accurately
	 x Verbal hand over of patient care is an important part of a norma working day in the life of a health care professional, which is taug and practiced at CIT
	 x Sounds may be coming from behind and around you, requiring a rapid response to call for medical help
	 x Wearing of masks and face shield are a requirement at CIT in the Simulated Learning Environment, which replicates teal work environment
	Tactile:
	x Detect changes in observations e.g. palpate a pulse
	 x Conduct a physical assessment and detect any anatomical abnormalities – lumps, changes to abdominal tension.
	 x Detect discreet changes in patient surface temperature and detect changes in circulation statuse.g. Cool and clammy or hot skin.
	x Provide therapeutic touch to comfort a patient

What are some examples of this? X Maintain a consistent level of physical energy to complete specific tasks in a timely manner over a designated work period. X Ability to perform repetitive activities with a level of concentration that ensures a capacity to focus on the activity until it is completed appropriately. X The capacity to maintain consistency and quality of performance throughout the designated period of duty.

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
